Twenty Years of Honoring Boston Authors

As part of the Boston Authors Club mission to further literary purposes and promote community among Boston-area authors, the BAC has presented annual awards since 1997 to outstanding books written by authors living within 100 miles of Boston. These awards are named after Julia Ward Howe, the Club's first President.

For the first three years of the awards, there was a single Julia Ward Howe Prize awarded for adult books (whether fiction, nonfiction, or poetry). A prize for an author in the Young Readers category was added in 2000. Last year, the BAC Board decided to expand the JWH awards program to recognize exceptional books by Boston area authors with prizes in four separate categories: Fiction, Nonfiction, Poetry, and the Young Readers.

The first Julia Ward Howe award, that of 1997, went to Igor Lukas for *Czechoslovakia between Stalin and Hitler* published by Oxford University Press. In 1998 the winner was Anita Diamant for *The Red Tent*. The first Young Readers award winner was Deborah Savage for *Summer Hawk in 2000*. From time to time, the BAC has also recognized outstanding authors with a Julia Ward Howe Lifetime Achievement award and occasionally it has added special awards to the annual program. Lifetime Achievement awards were bestowed on Robert Coles (2011), David McCullough (2012), Louis Gluck and Lois Lowry (2013).
