Summer Presentations by BAC Authors**



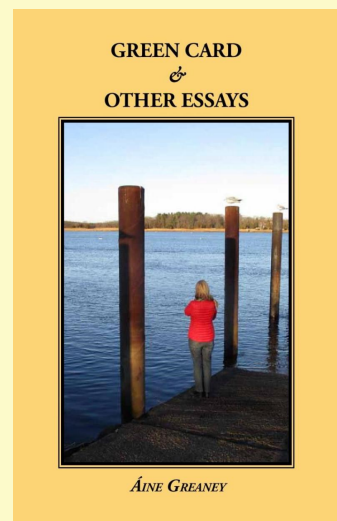
Kathleen Duple sends summer greetings to BAC members and the news that her latest book, *The Root of Magic* by Delacorte Press was published on June 11th.

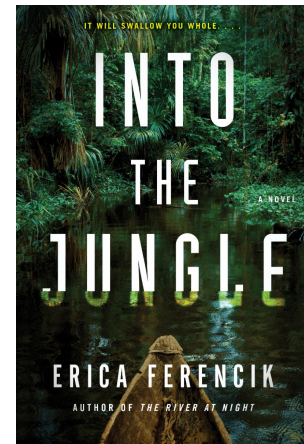

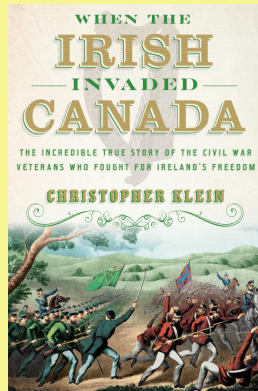

Diane Wald's new book, *Gillyflower*, published in April, won first place in the Next Generation Indie Book Awards novella category.

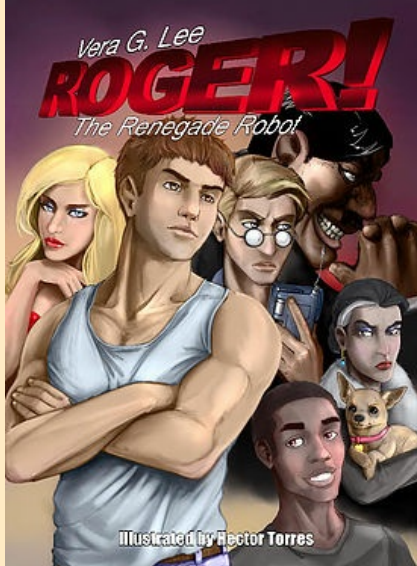
TRAVEL THRU HISTORY
